“Bricks for Bolivia,” a school-wide initiative to assist our sister parish in Bolivia with building a new facility to house church services, mission teams, village meetings, and more kicked off this past week. Last year, with generous donations from our parish and community, land was purchased in the village of Marampampa. This triggered much excitement and enthusiasm for Bolivians to be more self-sustaining and construct a new building. It will be built by the people under the supervision of an architect from LaPaz. The cost of construction is \$30,000 due in part to the cost of transporting the materials from LaPaz.



The SHS students will be collecting funds to help purchase the bricks to be used for the building. *Their goal is to raise \$2,000, which will buy approximately 400 bricks for the project.* Money will be collected from now until the end of school, in May of 2016.
