Feb. 2: 8:15am Prayer Service in the gym. Students are asked to wear red, white, and blue. We will make valentines for veterans and the homebound of the parish.

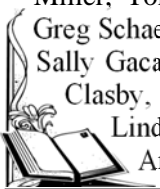

"Service to others above self" is just one of the many great attributes that Sacred Heart School students learn as part of their education.



When our students recently learned that their sister parish in Marampampa, Bolivia, did not have a church/community building in which to meet and hold services, they quickly got on board with "Bricks for Bolivia" project to help raise funds to construct a new building that would make a huge impact to the Sangre de Cristo (Blood of Christ) parish – especially to the children! They are asking for a donation of \$5 (or more) to purchase a "brick" for the building. "Bricks for Bolivia" has a goal of raising \$30,000 to complete the project. The students at Sacred Heart School have a goal of raising \$2,000, which will buy approximately 400 bricks for the project.

The students have created a virtual church in the school hallway where the students meet every morning for prayer. This church is being built with bricks made of construction paper, so that the students can envision the new church that they are helping to build. When a student donates \$5, they get to put their name and favorite Bible verse on a brick and place it on the wall, helping to visually create a new church for Bolivians.

School News . . .

We're off to a great start to our 3rd quarter at Sacred Heart School! The year is flying by, and we're having so much fun. Here is a glimpse into the daily lives of our students these past two weeks:

Preschool students started 2016 by learning the letter K, number 6, the rectangle, and the color blue. The students are working hard on writing their names correctly, and they also took a trip to the library this week!

Kindergarten students have enjoyed recent visits by Mr. O, who likes opposites, and by Mrs. H. In reading, the students read the book *Seeds*, and talked about how seeds grow into plants. In math, they are working on counting dimes and those tricky "teen numbers." The students will be learning all about Martin Luther King Jr. in January.

First grade students have begun to learn about the seven sacraments. In reading, they are working on the *Frog and Toad* book series. The students are learning about "how to" narratives and adjectives, and they are also writing friendly letters. The students have been focusing on Martin Luther King Jr. and also learning about polar animals.

Second grade students are focusing on the sacraments in religion. They are reading *Civil War on Sunday*, which is an excellent book from the "Magic Tree House" series. The students in grade 2 love having these books in their classroom, and this particular book is a great lead in to a discussion on the Civil War in social studies class. In math, the students are working on subtraction and the addition algorithm. They are talking about contractions in English. The students are excited to be learning to write in cursive this semester!

Third grade students recently started a great book called *7 Kisses in a Row*, which is a funny story about a small girl who is very demanding and wants many things including 7 kisses in a row. In math, they are learning about measurements using cups, pints, gallons, and measuring spoons. And to practice those measurements, they were able to make brownies in the school kitchen! In English, the students are focusing on verbs, and will also study "communities" in social studies class. The class was excited to welcome a new transfer student to their classroom this past week!

Fourth grade students are discussing the Ten Commandments in religion. In reading, they started a new chapter book, *The Castle in the Attic*, and will be making their very own castle in conjunction with their reading. In English, the students are learning the basics of a formal letter, and will be typing a letter in computer class. In math, they are busy working on multiplication facts and word problems.

Fifth grade students are learning about all 20 mysteries of the rosary this semester. Their teacher, Mrs. Zumbahlen, recently returned from a trip to the Holy Land, and is sharing her travel adventures with the students. They will hear about her visit to the sites where 19 of the mysteries took place! In math, the students are working on probability and fractions. In social studies, they are learning about the fight for the continent of North America between France, Great Britain, and Spain, along with many Native Americans. The students started to cantor at the school Masses this past week!

Sixth grade students began the year by focusing on the Beatitudes as given to us by Jesus from his Sermon on the Mount. In social studies, they are studying the ancient Greek culture, focusing on the geography of Greece, the important people of ancient Greece, and the gods and goddesses from Mount Olympus. In keeping with the theme of Greek mythology, they are reading *Percy Jackson: The Lightning Thief*, by Rick Riordan. In addition, the students will go on a mythology web hunt and create a mythology presentation in computer class. The students are very excited to learn that their teacher, Mrs. Albert, is expecting a baby boy, who is due in May of this year!

Seventh grade students have begun their much-anticipated study of the U.S. Constitution. They will learn all about how our government works, and sometimes doesn't work. They will see how elections take place using current events as examples. In religion class, the students are studying types of prayer. They have discussed the obstacles to having a good prayer life, as well as how to get past such obstacles. In math, they are adding variables to fractions before adding, subtracting, multiplying, or dividing. Just when they thought they knew everything about fractions, Mrs. Workman added a letter to the mix -- such fun!

Eighth grade students continue their preparation for Confirmation in the spring. They are finishing their service hours, will select a saint's name, and write a report on why they chose that particular saint. They ask for your prayers as they ready themselves for this sacrament. In literature, the students are reading a murder mystery called, *The Westing Game*. In science, they are learning about the atomic structure. In geography, they are studying the Illinois Constitution and government. In algebra, the students are reviewing how to write and solve linear equations to tackle real-world problems.
