

Padre's Point of View . . .

The Fractioning of the Precious Body

You have seen the priest take a piece of the Consecrated Host and fraction it and put the small piece into the chalice. Then he says quietly, "May this mingling of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it." This prayer is so simple yet so powerful; it speaks of our complete dependence of God and how God transforms us. It is beautiful to see the small piece of Consecrated Host taken over by the Precious Blood. Little by little, the Host becomes the color of the Precious Blood.

Here at Sacred Heart, we have two beautiful November customs: The Book of Remembrances and Jacob's Ladder.

Jacob's Ladder is the colloquial name of a bridge between the earth and heaven that the biblical Patriarch Jacob dreamt about. In his dream, Jacob saw angels "God's messengers" ascending and descending the ladder. The theme of a ladder to heaven is often used by the early Church Fathers to describe the Christian Church as the "ladder of ascent to God". Origin explains there are two ladders in the life of a Christian: the ladder we climb on earth to grow in virtue and the ladder we travel after death, climbing up to the heavens towards the light of God. So, if you have a picture of a **family member who died this year**, we encourage you to **place it on the ladder**, where we all can keep the memory of your loved one alive in thought and prayer.

The Book of Remembrances, also known as the "Book of Life," gives us an opportunity to record the names of our deceased loved ones for the parish to remember in prayer during the month of November. It will be placed near the Jacob's ladder. We invite you to take some prayer time, approach the book, and write the names of family and friends **who have died since November of 2015, into the corresponding year of their death**. During November, at all the Masses, we will pray for those "whose names are recorded in our Book of Remembrances." For those we have loved in life will remain in our hearts forever.

A **Mass of Remembrance** will be celebrated on Tuesday, Nov. 8, at 7:00pm, at Sacred Heart Church. We will pray for all those who are recorded in our death book who have passed away between Nov. 1, 2015 to Oct. 31, 2016. Everyone is invited to this Mass.

Ministry signup sheets are in the back of church for both the Mass of Remembrance on Nov. 8, at 7:00pm, and the Thanksgiving Mass at 8:30am. Please sign up as soon as possible so that we can finalize the schedule.

The Period of the Catechumenate
The Period of the Catechumenate embodies the first stages of commitment leading to full membership:

- For a person to enter this phase, she/he must already have come to faith in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and sincerely desire to become members of the Catholic Church.
- During this phase, the catechumens now gather with the Catholic community on Sundays for the first part of the Mass, during which, together, we hear the Scriptures, respond to them, and reflect on the meaning of God's Word for us personally and as community through the homily. After the homily, catechumens are dismissed, and with their catechist, continue a process of reflection and application of the Scriptures to their own lives.
- During this period, the initial conversion is deepened and appropriated; the person comes to know more and more deeply the love of God in their own lives and in the midst of the church community. This period, too, lasts as long as the person needs it to last, from a few months to several years, if necessary.
- For the unbaptized, this phase must normally last 12 months.
