The Second Sunday of Advent ~ As the journey of Advent continues, we prepare to celebrate the nativity of Christ, John the Baptist's call to conversion sounds out in our communities. It is a pressing invitation to open our hearts and to welcome the Son of God. It is with our everyday behavior in this life that we determine our eternal fate. At the end of our days on earth, we will be evaluated on the basis of our likeness or otherwise to the Baby Who is about to be born in the poor grotto of Bethlehem, because He is the measure God has given humanity.

With Christmas falling on Monday, many people will attend a Sunday morning Mass and then again on Christmas Eve that evening. I just want to clarify about receiving communion. You may receive communion at both Masses as the first Mass is for the Sunday liturgy, and the second Mass is for Christmas, which is a holy day.

This past Monday, we celebrated Adoration with our liturgical ministers and several of our parishioners. It was a great start to a faith-filled Advent season and we will continue Adoration monthly throughout the next year, so watch the bulletin for upcoming dates.

Please take home a Sacred Heart 2018 Catholic calendar which designates the holy days and feast days, and also includes our Mass and reconciliation schedules. Each month, there is a prayerful reflection on stewardship. A special thank you to Dust and Son Auto Supplies and the Keller family businesses for donating the calendars to our parish.

Synopsis of Fr. Michal's First Sunday of Advent homily . . .

As we begin our journey of Advent together, I want to thank each and every one of you for your involvement and support of Sacred Heart Parish. We have a great community and we are following our mission.

So what now? Eat, drink, and be merry?! Well, well... No! Get ready!

Are you ready to work?! We need you to be an active member of Sacred Heart. If someone wants to volunteer during the Mass as a server, lector, usher, Eucharistic Minister, sacristan, musician, etc. – please contact me, or our parish office. Don't be shy!

And many of you will say that you are not worthy to serve at the altar... Ok. Let me tell you something.

God still calls today. He calls us to walk with him, to be so full of His love that others will see the joy on our faces and want what we have. Christianity, it has been said, cannot be taught. It must be caught.

Perhaps, you're thinking: "Nah... I could never do that." You're wrong. Here is a list of some of the great people in the Bible. Every one of them had a reason for thinking God could not use them. So, the next time you feel like God can't use you, remember:

~ Restoration Update ~

As we mentioned last week, our Restoration Committee (Fr. Michal, Sr. Rene, Mike Schmitz, Vicki Walker, Marty Stock, Judy Luchtefeld, Judy Bergfeld, Penny Wiedman, and Christy Hakman) reviewed all your nearly 500 comments made during the Feasibility Study, and will be sharing the results and comments, as well as answering your questions and addressing your concerns here in the bulletin and before weekend Masses. Watch this space weekly for updates.

We were pleased to learn that 97% of the survey respondents felt it was very important or important to make aesthetic improvements including refinishing pews, replacing flooring, and addressing the finishes of our walls, beams, and ceilings. Based on your comments, here's some points we need to share:

Pews: We fully intend to refinish the pews to clean them up, fix the parts that are scratched, and have them stained (the same color or slightly lighter). IF the cost to replace the pews is cheaper, we will choose to do so, but we expect the refinishing to be more cost effective. The kneelers will be repaired and re-padded.

Flooring: We all agree we need new flooring but among the parishioners, there's varying opinions on carpet, tile, cork, or laminate. Currently, we are planning a combination of tile (altar and center isle) with carpeting under the pews. However, we have been talking with other churches about their flooring choices, and we are evaluating the feedback, but have not yet made a final decision. We are also working with a designer to direct us on carpet squares vs. rolls, etc. In addition, we are consulting with a sound/acoustic expert who will direct us on which type of flooring will work best for the acoustic success of our church.

Finishes: We plan to remove the "popcorn" look around the window areas and walls. As for the beams and the ceiling, we believe that a good cleaning will help to make it look nicer. We do not plan on painting any of the beams, walls, ceiling, etc. We intend to keep the rich wood that we all love in the church!

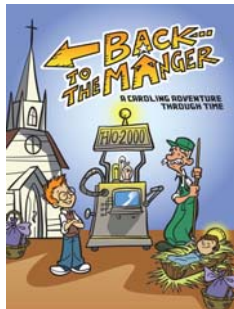

A Note from Fr. Paul Habing . . .

Perhaps, some young people of Sacred Heart Parish (*or children of all ages*) have seen the recently released movie “Coco” from Disney-Pixar. The animated movie has some basis as a custom in Mexico and many countries of Latin America: “El Día de los Muertos”. The Day of the Dead is celebrated from Nov. 1, All Saints Day through Nov. 2 All Souls Days, when many people remember the deceased members of their families in prayer at church, cemeteries, or their homes. Often in Mexico, people go to the tombs of their departed loved ones to place their favorite food and drink nearby. This is a way to remember the earthly lives of those so loved in life. Death is such a great mystery, but the movie “Coco” omits entirely our prayers for those who have passed from this life.

Sacred Heart Parish, including the Mexican-American community, prays devoutly for their departed loved ones as members of the Communion of Saints. One can certainly see this devotion at Mass in the priestly ministry. So, it might be good to clarify that a movie such as “Coco” has some big fallacies about our belief in the afterlife. Miguel, the little boy of unappreciated musical talent wants to know more about his great-great-grandfather who was a talented guitarist, singer, and actor many years ago in Mexico. So on the Day of the Dead, through some special power, Miguelito is able to pass over to look for his (real) father in the afterlife . . . though it is not such a nice place in the movie. The skeleton-faced departed and their intrigues in the afterlife are a very odd resemblance to our belief in eternal life!!

We read in 1 Thessalonians 4:14 *“For we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep”.* Also, Jesus’ words in John 14:2 remind us: *“My Father’s house has many rooms, if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you?”*

A redeeming feature of the movie “Coco” is the kind realistic view of extended family so appreciated in Mexico (e.g. Miguel’s love for his great-grandmother Coco whose departed son is Miguel’s father). So if your children have seen the movie, it might be good to explain to the children about our strong ties to the Faithful Departed through prayer in the Communion of Saints.

The first part of Advent now looks in quiet expectation to the Second Coming of Christ. We all meet the Lord in the Eucharist, our daily lives, and in our deaths to pass to eternal life. At our passing, we hope to see our Lord, the Beatific Vision, and his Mystical Body, the Church. That will be much better than any movie . . . “But, this is just as it has been written: The eye has not seen, and the ear has not heard, nor has it entered into the heart of man, what things God has prepared for those who love him.” 1 Corinthians 2:9
