The Third Sunday of Advent ~ This Sunday is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word meaning “rejoice.” The rose candle is lit. The change from purple to rose signifies the transition in season from repentance to celebration. The candle is called the “Shepherds Candle” and represents joy. Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near. This day reminds us of the joy that is to come, and serves, amid this season of penance, as a kind of ‘break’ when we recall the hope we have because of the coming of Our Lord Jesus.

~ Restoration Update ~

In our ongoing efforts to keep you informed on our proposed restoration in the church, our Restoration Committee (Fr. Michal, Sr. Rene, Mike Schmitz, Vicki Walker, Marty Stock, Judy Luchtefeld, Judy Bergfeld, Penny Wiedman, and Christy Hakman) continues to answer your questions and address your concerns here in the bulletin and before weekend Masses. *Watch this space weekly for updates.*

The sanctuary was definitely an item that many of you commented on when completing your surveys. Obviously, it's the center of our church, with a focus on the Tabernacle.

We appreciate your feedback, and we heard your concerns. We want to share with you the plans for the sanctuary and provide you with additional details. Please know that we are working with both our architect and a local designer (who is also a Sacred Heart parishioner) to get a more detailed rendering so that you can see how the updated sanctuary will look. For the time being however, here are some points to help you better understand the plans for the sanctuary.

The sanctuary platform will be raised one additional step to give more height and visibility. The second set of steps – the ones leading up to the Tabernacle – will be removed, so that there is only one level platform for easier accessibility. The current backdrop and the storage area behind it will be removed. This will not only enable us to add a handicap-accessible ramp on the left side of the sanctuary, but will also give us more useable space in the sanctuary.

We listened to your concerns and ideas about removing the wood from our current backdrop. The designer is helping us to create a new, updated backdrop that will incorporate the current wood slats into a new backdrop. The slats of wood will be cleaned and polished. We plan to keep the same finish and use the wood slats along with some acoustical panels. In doing this, as well as removing the current overhang above the Tabernacle, we will have a more open and refreshed sanctuary space but will also preserve the wood that so many parishioners love.

As for the altar itself, we're reviewing several ideas for a larger altar made of a combination of marble and wood. Once a design is finalized, we will utilize the same design to custom-build the ambo, the Tabernacle area, and the Baptismal Font, which will create a cohesive look.

Again, once a design is finalized, we will share the renderings of the sanctuary with all of you.


