~ Restoration Update ~

As we mentioned in previous weeks, our Restoration Committee (Fr. Michal, Sr. Rene, Mike Schmitz, Vicki Walker, Marty Stock, Judy Luchtefeld, Judy Bergfeld, Penny Wiedman, and Christy Hakman) reviewed all of your nearly 500 comments made during the Feasibility Study, and we will be sharing the results and your comments, as well as answering your questions and addressing your concerns each week before all of the Masses. In addition, this same information will be published in the bulletin.

***This week, we are addressing your thoughts about sound and lighting.***

We continually hear from parishioners about the poor sound quality both in the church and in our cry rooms. This too was true for almost all of you whom completed our recent survey and commented on the sound. We are proposing a new sound system with up-to-date equipment which will provide reliable sound clarity no matter where one sits in the church. A new system would allow us to add a much-desired "Hearing Loop" that works with hearing aids for the hearing impaired. We have enlisted the help of local sound and acoustic experts who are assisting us in choosing the best equipment for the needs of our church.

As for lighting, most everyone who completed the survey felt that we have inadequate lighting and that many areas inside the church are dark – especially when trying to read the missalette. We are proposing a switch from our current incandescent lighting to energy-saving LED bulbs, which will significantly improve our long-term costs. We are also proposing a large suspended ring of lights be added to the middle section of the church, so that it will spread a great deal of light throughout the church, and will also accent our beautiful wood ceiling and our Stations of the Cross. This suspended lighting will make it easier to access light fixtures and provide flexible lighting options for our nave and sanctuary.

Please know that we have requested a report which will help us to better estimate the costs to convert to LED lights as well as the expected energy savings over the years. Once we receive this report, we will share it with all of you.

### **School News . . .**

The students of Sacred Heart School have passed the half way mark, and have been busy in the last couple of weeks. *Here is a recap of their classroom activities:*

**Preschool students** are talking about the Three Kings and family (*both their family and Jesus' family*). In January, they are focusing on the rectangle, the number 6, and the color blue. The students are learning the letter L, and made a trip to the school library this week. They are also looking forward to their upcoming Family Fun Night.

**Kindergarten students** are learning that Jesus is with them everywhere they go, and that they can talk to Jesus no matter where they are located! The students will be focusing on writing three-letter words and sentences this quarter, and learning to compare numbers to see which one is bigger. Penguins are on parade in the kindergarten classrooms, and students will be learning all sorts of fun facts about these interesting animals.

**Grade 1 students** are learning all about the power of prayer! They are also working on reading fluency, drawing a conclusion, and making an inferences. The students have been “shopping” in math, and are learning to purchase multiple items, total the cost of the items, and create receipts. In phonics, they are learning some tricky combinations such as *er*, *ir*, and *ur*, and also focusing on contraction words in English. In addition, the first graders are learning about Martin Luther King Jr., polar animals, and winter vocabulary.

**Grade 2 students** are working on contractions in English. In math, they are focusing on addition facts as well as subtraction facts in hundreds. The students have recently started talking about the Civil War and Revolutionary War, and are learning about Abraham Lincoln, George Washington, and Martin Luther King Jr. In religion, the second graders are studying the sacraments and working on ways to show their love for God.

**Grade 3 students** are mastering their math multiplication facts, and also started their social studies unit by discussing different communities. They will soon be taking a field trip to the Effingham Museum to learn the history of the Effingham community. The third graders are reading the children’s classic, *The Little House on the Prairie*, and will be taking part in various hands-on activities to go along with the book. In religion, the students are concentrating on the Holy Spirit.

**Grade 4 students** have each selected a state which they will research. During the upcoming Open House on February 13, they will make a presentation detailing facts about their chosen state. They also recently started their social studies unit, and are learning about longitude and latitude. In reading, they are covering the book, *Snow Treasures*, and in English, they are studying verbs.

**Grade 5 students** have been learning about the Paschal Mystery, including the Passion, Death, Resurrection, and Ascension of Jesus. In math, they are working on expanded notation and finding averages. In social studies, they are learning more about Christopher Columbus, Magellan, and other explorers of the Americas. The fifth graders have begun a project researching the lives of various presidents. Each student will portray a U. S. president at the upcoming Open House on February 13.

**Grade 6 students** are excited to focus on the virtue of honesty this month and will lead the school-wide prayer each morning. In religion, they are learning about different images for the church as well as the Beatitudes. The students are reading *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio in literature class, and in English they are studying the different types of nouns and pronouns and how to use them correctly when speaking and writing. In social studies, the sixth graders are exploring South Asia and learning about the Indian and Persian empires.

**Grade 7 students** are discussing how to use the virtues in their daily lives. In history class, they are studying World War I, and will soon learn how the “war to end all wars” actually set us up for the next world war. The seventh graders are writing movie reviews in computer class and improving their Spanish.

**Grade 8 students** are busy preparing themselves for Confirmation. In literature, they have started reading the book *Wonder* by R.J. Palacio. They really enjoyed seeing the movie in December, so it is wonderful that they can now get the full story in book form. During science class, the students have been learning about the pH scale and how to identify acids and bases.
